

1. **Ogundele, B.O.** and Famuyiwa, S.A. (1998): Knowledge and Influential Factors of Drug Abuse of Selected Post-primary Institution Students in Oluyole Local Government of Oyo State, Nigerian School Health Journal, Vol. 5. No1.

This study examined the knowledge and influential factors of drug abuse in selected post-primary institution students in Oluyole Local Government Area of Oyo State, Nigeria. Using stratified random sampling technique a total of 450 students were selected from the secondary school population in the Local Government Area, Mean, percentages and inferential statistics of chi-square was used to test the formulated hypotheses at 0.05 alpha level of significance.

The findings revealed that the students possessed a significant knowledge of drug abuse. While influential factors of peer-group pressure, parental attitude, advertisement on electronic and print media and easy accessibility to drugs significantly influence drug abuse among the post-primary institution students. Appropriate recommendations were given at the end of the paper.
