The following are the research works presently being carried out by me:

1. **Motivational Factors and Job Satisfaction among Community Development Officers as Determinants of Effectiveness of Citizen Participation in Oyo State, Nigeria** (Commencement: 2014).

This research is investigating the organizational factors that affect the job satisfaction and performance of community development officers in Oyo State. Community development

officers are saddled with the main responsibility of mobilizing and enhancing community development in the various communities where they are posted. However, their productivity as change agents in the communities, depends on motivational factors and job satisfaction. A descriptive survey design method was adopted for this study with 771 respondents purposively selected as sample for the study. A questionnaire and Focus Group Discussion Guide are the main research instruments for the study. The fieldwork is now completed and data collected are being analysed.

## **2. Parental Socio-Economic Background as a Predictor of Child's Right Act Acceptance and Compliance among Parents in Ibadan Metropolis, Oyo State, Nigeria**

The abuse of children is a violation of their rights and this has a negative effect on affected children in many ways. The effects are reflected in low esteem, fear, mental disability, anxiety, lack of motivation, depression and poor academic performance in schools. Oyo State and some other states in Nigeria have adopted Child's Rights Acts, to put a stop or alleviate the impacts of child abuse in the state. It is, therefore, necessary to find out the extent to which parents have accepted and comply with the Child's Rights in the state. A descriptive survey design method was adopted for this study with respondents drawn from Ibadan Metropolis, Oyo State. The sample for the study was drawn from the urban and rural local government areas, making up the metropolis. Fieldwork is in progress (Commencement: 2015)

## **3. Community Social Responsibility as a Predictor of Poverty Alleviation Intervention among Youths in Oyo State, Nigeria**

In many communities, there is youth unemployment and general poverty among community members. Governments at different levels have been making attempts to alleviate poverty in the nation. Community development practice involves providing for welfare of the community members through various means, such as social infrastructures, building of schools, health centres and personal development. This study is investigating community social responsibilities which are reflected in provision of school fees to the youth, establishment of cottage industries for youth employment, etc. A descriptive survey design method was adopted for this study with respondents drawn from Egbeda

Local Government in Oyo State. A questionnaire and Focus Group Discussion Guide are the main research instruments for the study. Fieldwork is still in progress. (Commencement: January, 2016)
