To solve this problem therefore, distance learning programmes as instituted, has varied impact on such adults. Such impacts will therefore be identified at the end of the study.

2. Women Education and Gender Issues in Nigeria

The issue of discrimination against the provision of education for women on the basis of gender stereotype and traditional limitations has constituted a major local and international challenge in Nigeria and Africa respectively.

The stereotypical limitations placed by the traditional society have forced scholars to investigate on how such limitations can be removed in order to allow women and young girls to be given formal education which will only serve as the instrument that can make them functional and productive in the changing and globalised world.

3. Girl-Child Education

The study is set out to investigate the effect of Gender and Socio-Economic characteristics of parents on their attitude and disposition to girl-child education. This will go a long way to determine what policy decision to be articulated in improving and enhancing girl-child access to education in Nigeria.
