1. Youth Empowerment Programmes in Delta State: Sustainable Development Implication (It commenced in January, 2018).

Co-researcher: Ishokare, M. A

Department of Arts and Social Sciences Education,

University of Ibadan, Ibadan.

This study was set out to examine the level of youth awareness, knowledge and involvement in empowerment programmes for sustainable development in Delta State. Three research questions were generated in this study. Ex-post-facto research design using multiple stage sampling technique was used in selecting the samples. The study was carried out in nine Local Government Areas in Delta State with a total of 450 respondents. Three validated self-designed instruments titled Youth Awareness and Involvement in Empowerment Programmes for Sustainable Development (YAIEPSD) (r = 0.82); Youth Knowledge of Empowerment Programmes for Sustainable Development Questionnaire (YKEPSDQ) (r = 0.73) and Youth Involvement in Empowerment Programmes for Sustainable Development Questionnaire (YIEPSDQ) (r = 0.89) were used to collect data. Data collected would be analysed using descriptive and inferential statistics. The findings would reveal the extent by which youth aware of the empowerment programmes, their knowledge and involvement. The implications of the findings will be

discussed in regards of achievement of sustainable national development. It is expected to be concluded before the end of September, 2018.
