FOCUS OF MY RESEARCH

My research focuses mainly on contemporary methods and strategies of sports organization and administration.

The works had been approached from the areas of sports administration, officiating in sports and character building through sports.

Organization and Administration of Sports and Physical Education

In my quest, I have utilized modern and scientific approaches to enlighten sports administrators especially in Nigeria, thereby serving as a corrective measure to the questionable ways which sports administrators run sports. My effort in this area was focused on the coordination of activities, directing formulation of plans, instruction, guidance relating to sports and physical education, with the view to accomplishing the desired goals and objectives of the programmes (Items 3, 7, 12, 14, 1, 17, 18, 21, 22, 32, 35, 40, 43, 45, 48, 49).

Officiating in Sports and Games

My researches in this area had been tailored towards capacity building for sports officiating officials, bearing in mind that the place of officiating in sports cannot be overemphasized. This effort culminated in my looking into various ways of training the would-be officials, assessing their knowledge about current issues on officiating and creating conducive environment for them through enlightenment programmes for all stakeholders in sports in the bid to avoid violence or hooliganism in sports competitions.

The works focus on how officiating can be carried out and improved during local and international competitions (see items 8, 11, 12, 18, 20).

Values and Ethics in Sports

My research effort has identified and analysed the values and ethics in sports and physical education, which are to guide the athletes, coaches and Physical Educators on how the effective domain of sports and Physical Education can be achieved. Under this section, my work has highlighted the integration of the cognitive domain of Physical Education and sports with the view of solving problems that may be encountered as one participates in sports and Physical Education.
