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Profile and Key Qualifications

Professor Ajibola O. Falaye has thirty years of University teaching, research and consulting experience in Counseling, Educational and Developmental Psychology and administration. During this period she has taught Counselling and Developmental Psychology courses at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels at the University of Ibadan. Professor Falaye has participated in various sponsored projects related to educational development and quality assurance in Nigeria. She was on the consultancy team to the Federal Government on University Autonomy in 1996. In 1997 she participated, under the auspices of the Network For Gender Sensitive Education Management in Africa (NEGSEMA) in the British Council sponsored project on Arresting School Drop-out rates among girls (and boys) in Ondo and Ekiti States . She was in the follow up team of the same project in 1998. Professor Falaye participated in evaluative and quality assurance programmes in the field of Education, such as the Teacher Mentoring project under the auspices of the Universal Basic Education Commission in 2001, supervising Zone D in the South-Eastern parts of Nigeria. She also was in the team assessing the utilization of 2003 budgetary allocation on basic education in the country. She was in the team assessing utilization of the 2003 Universal Basic Education budgetary allocation in Imo State.

Professor Falaye in 2004, under the auspices of NEGSEMA, actively participated in the UNICEF sponsored project on the writing of the teaching

modules for gender sensitive education in Nigeria. In 2007 Professor Falaye was on the team that wrote the report on the 2006 National Personnel Audit in the Universal Basic Education in the country.

She was the Principal Researcher in the Ogun State Secondary Education Study under the National Secondary Education Strategy, a World Bank-UBE project; a technical report submitted to the Ogun State Ministry of Education in 2004.

She has actively participated in the Personnel Psychology programme in the Department of Guidance and Counselling being a former coordinator of the programme. She organized leadership training programmes, seminars and workshops as well as supervised programmes and projects for personnel at all cadres and in diverse organizational settings. She has close interaction with health personnel as she currently teaches, hold seminars and workshops at the Institute of Child Health; Biomedical Education programme in the Faculty of Clinical Sciences and at the Centre for Child and Adolescent Mental Health, Department of Psychiatry; all at the College of Medicine University of Ibadan.
