My area of interest and research activities encompass the related fields of records and information management, archives administration and the conservation of library and archival materials. Records and by extension archives may be defined as information media which have been generated from within an organization and the management of which has been delegated to a specialist service. The purpose of this delegation is to maximize the social utility of these media through preservation and exploitation.
